London hosts major disability event Disabled people to give their views

London is set to host a major disability event – and organisers are encouraging disabled people from across London and beyond to take part.

The event has been organised by Equality 2025, a UK-wide network of disabled people.

More than 100 people are expected at the event, which will take place on 30 June at Upton Park – home of West Ham United FC.

Organiser Michelle Daley says: “Equality 2025 was set up to advise the Government on the policies and services that affect disabled people.

“This is a real opportunity for disabled people to tell us about the issues that matter to them.

“We’re particularly keen to hear from disabled people from all backgrounds, including those who haven’t taken part in consultations before.

“We want to hear about your experiences as a disabled Londoner and what that means to you.”
